

Biosecurity update – Queensland now accepts ICA-62 and PS-59 for tomato potato psyllid (TPP) compliance

What has changed for Victorian businesses?

Victorian businesses can now use ICA-62 and PS-59 to meet Queensland entry requirements for tomato potato psyllid (TPP) for eligible non-host nursery stock.

- ICA-62: Treatment and inspection of carrier nursery stock for tomato potato psyllid.
- PS-59: Treatment or inspection or secure packing of carrier nursery stock for tomato potato psyllid.

ICA-62 and PS-59 are already accepted by New South Wales, South Australia and Tasmania (subject to chemical limitations). This update confirms that Queensland now also accepts these arrangements. This may help businesses streamline certification, as the same arrangements can be used to meet entry requirements in multiple jurisdictions.

Important to note

ICA-62 and PS-59 are only needed for eligible non-host nursery stock entering Queensland where the stock has been grown, produced or stored at the same place (including a property or facility) as host plants (Solanaceae or Convolvulaceae). Host nursery stock (Solanaceae or Convolvulaceae) cannot be certified under these arrangements.

Actions for Victorian businesses

Victorian businesses should review their existing TPP ICA and PS arrangements, noting that ICA-62 and PS-59 are now available for trade to Queensland. If you wish to add a new arrangement or withdraw an existing arrangement, please contact your regional plant biosecurity team.
